LUNAR NEW YEAR DAY AT THE CAPITOL

History was made under the Gold Dome this week as Georgia's inaugural Asian American Pacific Islander Caucus celebrated **Lunar New Year at the Capitol**, which was recognized on February 15th in conjunction with <u>Asian</u> <u>American Advocacy Day at the Capitol.</u>

Part of this celebration was the **first ever traditional lion dance under the Gold Dome**, an exuberant custom celebrated across many East Asian cultures to usher in a prosperous, healthy, and auspicious new year!








We started the day with some <u>community recognitions</u>, where we commended the work of three groups that have been leaders in the AAPI community.

Speaking of issues that affect the immigrant community...

ALIEN LAND LAW BILLS

The paired Alien Land Law bills, which **would restrict the ability of Georgians of certain national origins from buying or leasing property**, appear to be moving rapidly through their respective chambers.

HB 1093, sponsored by <u>Rep. David Clark</u>, <u>passed out of the House Agriculture</u> <u>Committee on February 14th</u> and could be placed on the Rules Calendar for a House Floor vote as early as Tuesday.

#HB1093, the newest Alien Land Law bill that precludes individuals of certain national origins from real estate purchases, and which violates the Fair Housing Act, just passed out of the House Agriculture Committee.

Expect a fight.

Meanwhile, **SB 420**, the Senate version of the bill, was <u>heard on the same day in</u> <u>the Senate Regulated Industries committee</u>. The bill was problematic enough that the Chair of the committee, <u>Senator Bill Cowsert</u>, did not bring it to a vote, though as it clearly appears to be a Republican priority I would expect it to return for reconsideration and a vote before Crossover Day.

Here **Jeff Ledford**, **Chief Advocacy Officer of the <u>GA Association of</u> <u>REALTORS**</u>, testifies that the bill violates federal law preventing housing discrimination, and would also cripple Georgia's export industry.

I had the pleasure of speaking with **Donna Lowry** on <u>GPB "Lawmakers"</u> about these Alien Land Law Bills and their impact on the immigrant community in Georgia.

In addition to walking through the illegality of bills like this, I noted that when lawmakers who look like me, or other members of the AAPI Caucus, speak out against these bills, it incites some to question our priorities and our loyalties. As a Chinese American serving in the Georgia State Legislator, I am often accused of being not American, a spy, a plant, and an agent of the Chinese Communist Party.

This type of stereotyping, and the knee-jerk conflation of individual Georgians with their family's country of origin and the foreign

regimes governing those countries, is precisely why bills like HB 1093 and SB 420 are so problematic.

Georgia Senate advances tax break for firearm safety devices as lawmakers push gun-related incentives

Just this past week, <u>a bipartisan bill</u> that would **offer up to a \$300 tax credit for purchase of safe storage equipment** was <u>voted unanimously out of the</u> <u>House Ways and Means Committee</u>, which means it could be put on the Rules calendar and voted off the House floor as early as this week.

Jill Nolin, a reporter with the *Georgia Recorder*, <u>covered this issue</u> and the rash of new Republican bills and the fresh bipartisan enthusiasm around the issue of safe storage.

"GA2A supports any legislation that would lessen the financial burden of possessing and storing firearms," the group said in a statement last month.

That bill's sponsor, Rep. Michelle Au, has signed on in support of the GOP proposal.

"I'm deeply gratified that our Republican colleagues have come to agree that prioritizing safe storage and other measures to encourage responsible gun ownership is a crucial part of keeping our families safer," Au, a Johns Creek Democrat, said Tuesday. "I will continue to support these bills and hope that we can continue this conversation around the safe storage of firearms."

GEORGIA LEFT BEHIND

This week it was announced that <u>a Medicaid expansion bill will arrive in the</u> <u>Mississippi Senate by Monday</u>, beginning a process that could **provide health care to about 230,000 working Mississippians.**
