In particular, restrictions the practice of **in vitro fertilization has been making state and national headlines in the past few months.** In recent newsletters, I have written about states across the South like <u>Louisiana</u> and <u>Alabama</u> making efforts to restrict access to in vitro fertilization. In all, <u>at least 13 states have pending legislation that threatens IVF treatment</u>.

THE OPIOID EPIDEMIC AND RISK MITIGATION



The country is in the midst of an opioid epidemic, and Georgia has not been immune.

Opioid-involved overdose deaths in Georgia <u>increased by 302% between 2010 and 2022</u>, and between 2019 and 2022 <u>fentanyl-involved drug overdose deaths increased by 308%</u>. In the setting of a state with stark healthcare disparities and severe challenges to accessing mental health care, **this creates a public health crisis** that affects thousands of patients and their communities.

As an anesthesiologist, opioid-sparing pain treatment strategies are a key part of my work. As such, I am proud to have been selected by House Speaker Jon Burns to participate on the <u>House Study Committee on Alternatives</u> to Opioids for Pain Management.

Gun violence is a public health issue, and is now the #1 cause of death of children and teenagers in the United States. It therefore naturally follows that healthcare providers have been a key part of our working coalition to pass common sense gun safety legislation in Georgia.

Two of our incredible gun safety advocates, **Dr. Sofia Chaudhary** and **Dr. Mike Greenwald** of **Georgia Clinicians for Gun Safety**, wrote <u>a powerful</u> <u>piece in the AJC</u> chastising the Republican majority for not doing more with their power to protect Georgians and their families.

"Fourteen bills introduced in the Georgia Legislature in the 2023-24 cycle could have reduced gun violence. One of the few encouraging developments was that the Pediatric Health Safe Storage Act (HB 161) received a hearing in 2023; but, despite public support, it did not get a hearing in the 2024 session. A bill offering a modest tax credit for gun safes and safety training (HB 971) passed the House and the required committees in the Senate, but it did not make it to the Senate floor for a vote. Other bills did not get a hearing, let alone a vote."

Dr. Greenwald and Dr. Chaudhary, with many of their colleagues and partners with the Georgia Majority for Gun Safety, were at the Capitol nearly every day

talking with legislators and tirelessly advocating alongside us to pass these bills. I could not be more proud to have the support of these brave, committed public health leaders as we continue to fight the good fight together.


